

## Health Team Guidelines for Ebenezer Baptist Please Social Distance When Possible

- 1. Everyone should wear a mask when entering or leaving a building Doors open at 9:00 am for Worship. Ebenezerites, please exit Worship service with your mask on as soon as service ends.
- 2. Masks need to worn at all times in the Sunday School classes 3K and older.
- 3. For Sunday School Children will be dropped off and picked up at the glass doors to Young Hall breezeway to limit the number of people in and out of Young Hall.

Thank you to all church members, team members and friends who donated to send food and supplies to the people of Honduras who were devastated by two hurricanes and several tropical storms recently. Many houses and farms washed away or were covered by mud slides.

We were able to send food for 232 families with our food bucket donations, 112 hygiene kits, 400 Gospel of John booklets, 2 wheelchairs, crutches, canes, a bedside commode, 55 bed pillows, 8 tubs of very important medication needed in the clinics and 87 boxes of clothing, shoes, blankets, masks amd other medical items. Overall, 151 boxes were packed and shipped.

Ebenezer follows the Great Commission with mission activities both locally and internationally.
